As a nonprofit organization, we believe in the importance of community. Everyone should have access to information and supportive services that allow for personal choices and continued independence to lead a dignified life.

Since 1973, we have provided services and support to seniors in Santa Clara County. At Sourcewise, we continue to support seniors and caregivers as we expand our reach to include persons with disabilities and all adults in Santa Clara County. We aim to inform, educate, and prepare all adults within Santa Clara County to better navigate their health and life options.



Sourcewise Programs

Our goal is to provide leadership addressing issues that relate to older individuals in Santa Clara County, develop community-based systems of care that support independence within Santa Clara County's interdependent society; protect the quality of life of older persons and persons with functional impairments; and promote citizen involvement in the planning and delivery of services.

Core Programs

The first step to getting the help you need is learning what help is available. **Information & Awareness at Sourcewise** specializes in connecting you with information and services, enabling you to understand the resources available to you and your loved ones.

Caregivers Network by Sourcewise provides ongoing support and access to family caregiver support services and resources for informal caregivers. Services include MyPlan by Sourcewise, referrals, case management, and temporary respite care solutions. **MyPlan by Sourcewise** is an innovative communication platform that supports the idea that an effective caregiver is one whose needs are being met along with those of the person being cared for.

The Sourcewise Care Management program is the home of the **Multipurpose Senior Services Program (MSSP)**. MSSP is designed to assist frail older adults 65 years or older who are at risk of nursing home placement. We focus on helping you to remain living safe at home by developing a care plan to avoid premature institutionalization. We continue to provide help as you return home after a hospitalization, a stay in a skilled nursing facility, or an intermediate care facility.



The Digital Inclusion Program, in partnership with the California Department of Aging, strives to mitigate loneliness and isolation among older adults by providing them with greater access to technology, training, resources, and information to bridge the digital divide. Projects include the **Google Home Smart Speaker Program** and **Connections, Health, Aging, and Technology (CHAT) Program**.

The **Health Insurance Counseling & Advocacy Program (HICAP)** is designed for community members who want to be savvy health insurance consumers. Sourcewise provides residents of Santa Clara County access to one-on-one counseling to assist Medicare beneficiaries, their families, and caregivers to understand their Medicare benefits and healthcare options.

Meals on Wheels offers well-balanced meals to eligible homebound individuals (60 years of age or older) on a weekly basis. Lunch/dinner meals are delivered frozen so they can be microwaved and enjoyed at the recipient's convenience.

Public Authority Services facilitates independent living by administering a database of pre-screened IHSS Independent Care Providers, enabling care providers to provide quality service without IHSS care recipients/consumers needing to expend their own resources to vet prospects, negotiate wages, and administer care provider health benefits. Public Authority Services also facilitates enrollment into the IHSS program for care providers, allowing care recipients to hire whomever they choose to provide their IHSS authorized services.

Senior Community Services Employment Program (SCSEP) assists qualified seniors who are 55 years of age or older with the opportunity and support needed to obtain employment. We provide paid on-the-job training to assist you in developing occupational skills, practical work experience, and individual confidence to facilitate your transition to permanent unsubsidized employment opportunities.


Sourcewise **South County Services** acts as a community support hub for vital services and resources for the Southern Valley of Santa Clara County. Community members are able to receive referrals, request assistance for reading and preparing bills, and more. In circumstances where an older adult needs extensive resources, you can apply to receive **South County Care Management Services** and receive assistance with developing care and coordinating with providers. **South County Transit Services** provides safe, door-to-door transportation for seniors to medical appointments, pharmacies, and grocery stores in Gilroy, San Martin, and Morgan Hill.



RESPONDING TO COVID-19

Overcoming Barriers

From the California Association for Agencies on Aging (C4A): “The global COVID-19 pandemic created a time of unprecedented need. The effects on the aging population are many and varied and the impacts are likely to be lasting.” Sourcewise is proud to be a part of a larger network of community-based systems of care. As we navigate through the challenges caused by COVID-19, our top focus as the Area Agency on Aging in Santa Clara remains to provide the tools and services that will help create meaningful change for older adults living during, through, and after this pandemic.



2021 COVID-19 Impact Survey

In response to these unprecedented times, Sourcewise released our second COVID-19 Impact Survey to gather vital insights from residents of Santa Clara County.

Sourcewise received 2,592 responses to the 2021 COVID-19 Impact Survey. Recorded responses identified gaps in access to basic services, reliable transportation, and programming, and also reflected the amplification of known challenges due to COVID-19. These known challenges included access to reliable and working technology devices and connectivity; feelings of social isolation, and stress on both paid and unpaid caregivers.

We look forward to fostering community partnerships with fellow senior and caregiver service providers serving Santa Clara County and continue to search for new ways to respond to emerging needs resulting from COVID-19.




Sourcewise & Subgrantee Total Revenue FY 2021-2022


