Starting January 1, 2026, adults age 19 and older without Satisfactory Immigration Status (SIS) will no longer be able to newly enroll in full-scope Medi-Cal. If you're undocumented and currently receiving benefits, complete your renewal on time to maintain coverage.

How to Apply?

- Proof of ID
- Income verifications (recent paycheck or tax returns)
- Housing expenses (rent/mortgage, water bill, PG&E bill, etc)
- Health insurance information

Full-scope Medi-Cal includes comprehensive services beyond emergency care, such as outpatient, maternity, mental health, and more. If you have SIS, you or someone you know would be a U.S. citizens, nationals, and certain non-citizens like lawful permanent residents and refugees would not be affected by these changes.

Medi-Cal Redetermination

Medi-Cal redetermination is the yearly process to confirm eligibility for benefits. Most people with full-scope or limited-scope Medi-Cal will not be affected and will continue receiving coverage. If action is needed, you'll get a renewal packet in a yellow envelope. To stay covered, complete and return the form with any required documents by the deadline.

How to Complete Medi-Cal Redetermination Process

You can complete the redetermination process online at *benefitscal.com*, by mail, in person, or by phone. Be sure to keep your contact information up to date to avoid missing important notices. If you miss the deadline, you may lose coverage but can request reinstatement within 90 days.
