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New Programs & Initiatives

Emergency Assistance Plan (EAP)

Thanks to a \$30,000 grant from SCAN Health Plan, 50 older adults received one-time emergency payments to cover essential needs such as housing, utilities, food, and personal care. This support helped pay rent so older adults could remain safely in their homes, covered electricity and gas bills to keep them warm without forcing them to choose between food and shelter, and provided grocery gift cards so they could buy food and prepare meals.

Fall Prevention

Sourcewise improved home safety for 203 older adults in Santa Clara County by installing grab bars, ramps, and railings at no cost. These modifications reduced the risk of falls and supported independent living. The program extended to include educational workshops and grant opportunities, giving older adults the knowledge and resources to keep their homes safe and accessible for years to come.

Veterans Directed Care

We launched a new partnership with Palo Alto Veterans Affairs and successfully enrolled 12 veterans into the new Veterans Directed Care program. This initiative helps veterans and their families hire caregivers, giving them more independence and control over their care. In 2025–2026, we are expanding our veteran support program to surrounding counties to reach more veterans and their families.
